CYNTHIA L. LORD MEMORIAL PLAQUE PRESENTED TO IBER HOLMES GOVE MIDDLE SCHOOL

On November 2, 2012, members of the RHS Alumni Association Committee presented a plague to Ellen Small, IHGMS Principal in memory of Cynthia L. Lord.

Cynthia was a junior high English teacher at Raymond Consolidated School beginning in 1954, and over the years, assumed teaching duties at the high school level, as well as taking on the role of assistant principal during the principal's absence. She also coached girls' basketball and softball before retiring in 1979 as a highly respected teacher and role model for her students and fellow colleagues.

At the 2010 Homecoming Reunion, Cynthia was honored by her former students, colleagues, and friends with their personal messages that were presented to her in a "memory" book that she was to enjoy and keep by her side the last year of her life.

Cynthia at 91 years died on January 3, 2012 following a period of declining health, but her legacy lives on in the hearts and minds of the thousands of students whose lives she touched.

The Reach High Scholars Program

The Reach High Scholars Program was started about five years ago by the Alumni Association, in conjunction with a group of RHS faculty members, parents and alumni. The Program supplements the resources that the Raymond School District is in a position to provide at no cost to the School District. It encourages Raymond Middle School and High School students to "reach high" in their pursuit of an education. Information on the Program is available at: www.reachhighscholars.org.

Current Initiatives of the Reach High Scholars Program

- (i) furnishing information on colleges and the financial aid which they offer;
- (ii) the maintenance of a website: www.reachhighscholars.org;
- (iii) organizing visits for RHS students to several schools that are within a one or two-day drive from Raymond and contributing a portion of the transportation expenses;
- (iv) encouraging RHS students to attend summer enrichment programs at top educational institutions;
- (v) encouraging students to take courses on-line that are not available at RHS, including honors and advanced placement courses;
- (vi) providing college preparation help, including a course to prepare for the PSAT and SAT tests;
- (vii) paying a portion of the fees for RHS students applying to summer programs, preparing for and taking standard college admission tests and applying to four-year colleges;
- (viii) the Reach High Scholars Club, a student-run extracurricular activity; and
- (ix) Raymond Roundtables, a summer enrichment program in Raymond for middle school and ninth grade students conducted by Phillips Exeter Academy.

Summer Enrichment Programs

Summer enrichment programs at top educational institutions are an important strategic component of the Reach High Scholars Program. Strong partnerships have been established with programs at Brown University, Dartmouth College, Phillips Exeter Academy and St. Paul's School. These four partners have given over \$200,000 of financial aid to Raymond students during the past few years.

In the summer of 2012, there were 52 Middle School and High School students in summer enrichment programs (compared to one five years ago). Sixteen were in boarding programs of two to five weeks and 36 participated in Raymond Roundtables in Raymond during the month of July.

College Results

There are 14 RHS students who were active in the Reach High Scholars Program now attending highly competitive colleges. In the prior history of RHS, 17 people had graduated from one of those colleges. RHS alumni currently are attending Brown, Dartmouth [2], Hamilton, Hobart & William Smith, Holy Cross, Lafayette, RPI [2], Skidmore [3], Trinity and Wheaton. Most of these students have significant financial aid packages that include relatively small amounts of debt.

In 2012, RHS had the highest percentage of students going to top colleges of any high school in Southeastern NH. The detailed data is in the following document.
